Why do we have to have Entry Forms, Signing-in and Conditions of Entry?

This is a question we are often asked as members of the Committee.

In this constantly changing world there are ever more regulations being imposed which we, as a Club, have to comply with. In the main these relate, as far as the Club is concerned, more often than not, to Insurance and Health and Safety matters. Surprisingly, perhaps, it is very often not the Committee who make these conditions, but it is the owners of the properties who are kind enough to permit us to show our vehicles on their land. This is particularly true of council owned locations, where the Co-ordinator of the event not only has to provide a Certificate of Liability Insurance, but also a Risk Assessment and a list of exhibitors and their vehicles, all of which, if not provided, could result in the show being closed down immediately, should a Council Health and Safety Inspector choose to visit.

Also, when it comes to the owners of private land, the rules are very much the same regarding Insurance, Risk Assessments and entries. Additionally, it is often the land owners who determine the other conditions e.g. that dogs are not permitted, oil trays or mats must be used, vehicles must arrive before the opening time and not leave before the closing time or whilst the general public are present, nor should there be any vehicle movement whilst the event is open to the public.

Inevitably, there will be unforeseen circumstances when it is not possible to arrive on time or there will be a need to leave early. The simple answer to this is to contact the event Co-ordinator or Marshal and, explaining the circumstances, request to be escorted in or out of the show.

Each entry form lists the Conditions of Entry and entrants sign below these stating that they agree with the conditions. In the event of being unable to comply with these conditions, then please do not send in an entry.

If members, or the Club officials, do not to comply with these conditions it could result in a loss of venues at which to show our vehicles, and taking pride in showing our vehicles is really what the Club is all about.
